

Call for Papers: Special Issue of Pe'amim: Studies in Sephardic Jewry

Theme: Migrations and Multiple Homelands

Following the international workshop "Migrations and Multiple Homelands," held on February 15–17, 2026, the editorial board of *Pe'amim: Studies in Oriental Jewry* invites **workshop participants and members of the wider scholarly community** to submit original research articles for a special thematic issue arising from the workshop's scholarly exchange.

Scope of the Issue: The issue will focus on Jewish migrations and the evolving concept of "homeland" in Sephardic and Mizrahi contexts.

'Multiple homelands' can be explored as the transmission of legal and family traditions across pre-modern borders. The term 'multiple homelands' reflects the negotiation of loyalty, citizenship, and identity in the passage from empires to nation-states. Finally, multiple homelands may be explored as a modern reconstruction of "home" through language, cinema, memory, and as a social category.

The issue will explore what the study of Jews from Islamic lands can contribute to broader debates on migration and transnationalism.

Submission Guidelines:

- **Eligibility:** Open to participants in the "Migrations and Multiple Homelands" workshop, as well as to members of the wider scholarly community.
- **Review Process:** All manuscripts will undergo standard double-blind peer review in accordance with the journal's academic regulations.
- **Language:** Submissions accepted in English or Hebrew.
- **Article Length:** Up to 10,000 words.
- **Style and Formatting:** Articles must follow the [Pe'amim Style Guidelines](#).
